- Work with and under the direction of the Deputy Commissioner of Indigenous Corrections, within the Indigenous Initiatives Sector (IIS) at CSC Regional Headquarters in Saskatoon, SK (TBC).
- Liaison with the Federation of Sovereign Indigenous Nations Indian Justice Commission to support First Nations interests concerning healing and reintegration
- Liaise with the Health Service Sector (HS) at CSC at the national and regional levels to support intersectoral and interdisciplinary collaboration between IIS and HS.
- A reciprocal exchange of knowledge and experiences working across sectors.
- An opportunity to contribute to the strengthening of relationships between FSIN, Indigenous Communities and CSC.

- The opportunity to contribute to the decolonization of correctional health services by helping to integrate Indigenous healing practices in collaboration with Traditional Healers and Cultural Practitioners into CSC's Health Service delivery model.
- An opportunity to build on your existing competencies and gain new skills, experiences and perspectives related to the Government of Canada.
- The opportunity to bring this knowledge back to FSIN to strengthen our capacity to continue to work effectively with the CSC and other federal government departments.
